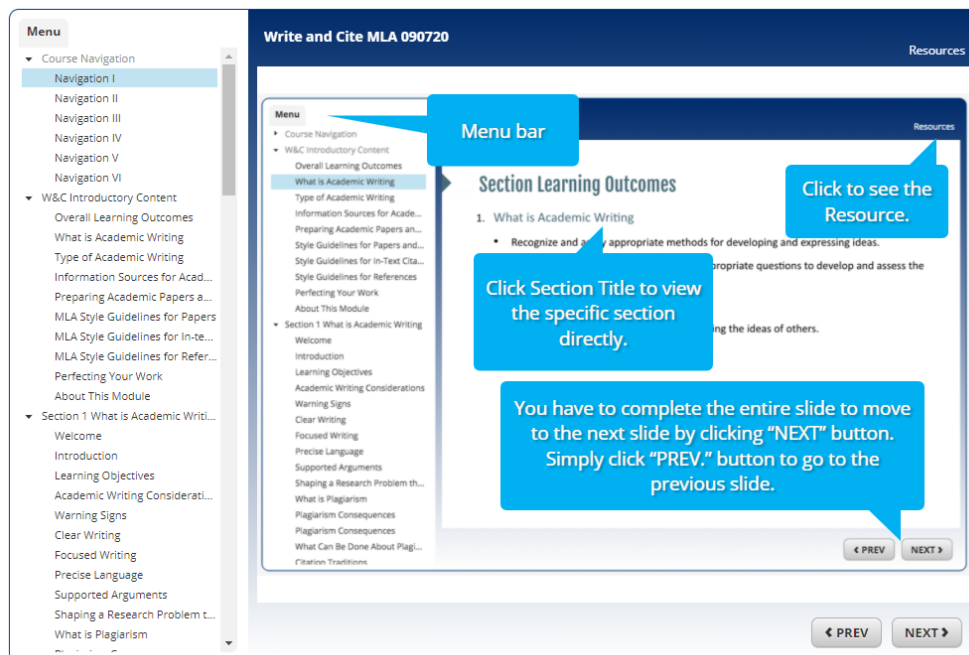

What is the overall structure and time constraints of the Write & Cite: Academic Writing Readiness Course?

- ❖ There are 8 total modules that make up the Write & Cite course.
- ❖ Each module will provide 3-5 learning sections, though a couple modules will only consist of one section.
- ❖ The courses will teach APA, MLA, or CMS documentation styles depending on the Write & Cite version that your institution is requiring you to take. The remaining modules will provide instruction regarding word choices, tone, papers organization, literature-based research, and techniques to avoid plagiarism.
- ❖ Each course starts with a twenty-question pre-test which must be completed prior to starting the instructional material.
- ❖ Each section will conclude with a 5-question quiz. To advance to the next section, you must answer 3 questions correctly. If after the 5-question quiz, you do not answer 3 questions correctly, you will need to redo the prior section.
- ❖ The courses will conclude with a 50-question competency exam with questions randomly drawn from the entire course. The competency exam does offer a retake option, however only the last score is recorded and your first score will not be retrievable.

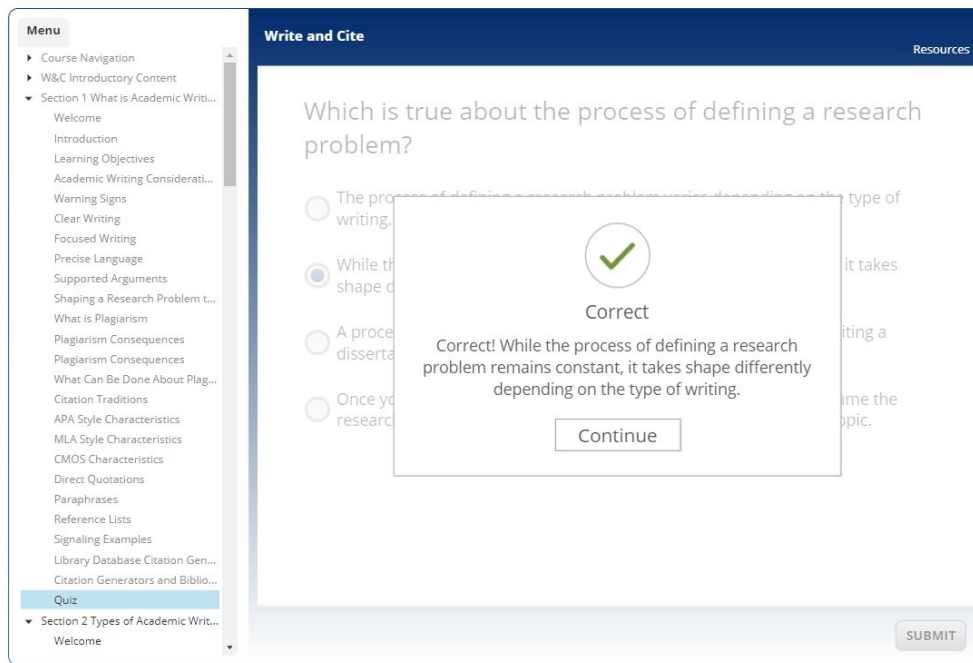

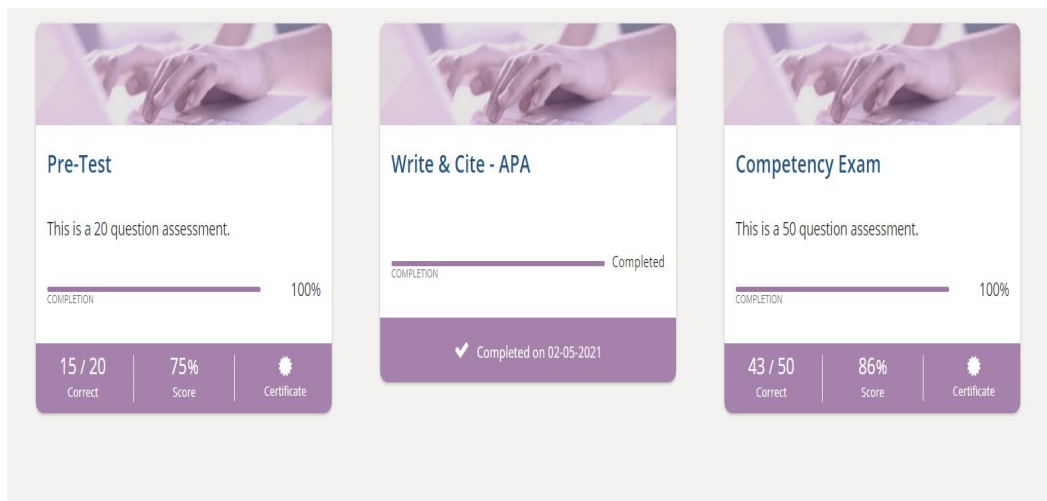

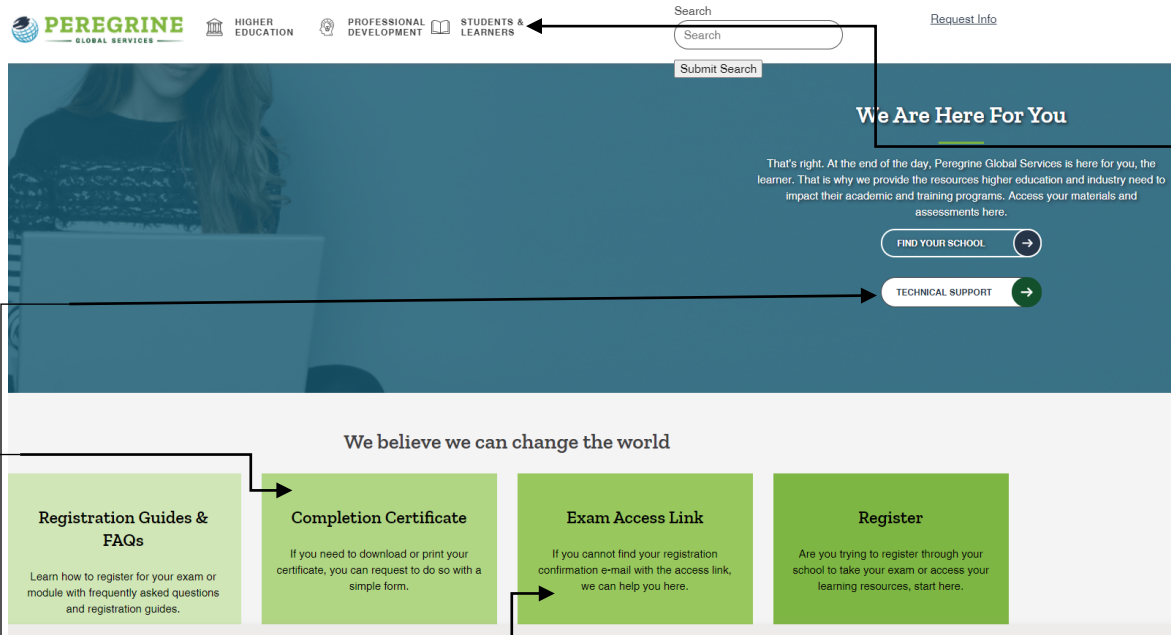
